Description:	 Amendments to existing hunting regulations for wild pig as a result of Senate Bill 856 (2022), including: establishing baseline regulations for exotic game mammals, including definitions, shooting hours, authorized take methods, and prohibitions on feeding; reclassifying wild pig as an exotic game mammal; striking wild pig from various sections associated with big game mammals; adding the exotic game mammal classification to general hunting regulations and establishing a wild pig validation and reporting framework; extending the validity of depredation permits for wild pig from one year to up to five years; and replacing tags with a validation for the take of wild pigs.
