- **Description:** The proposed changes amend applicable regulations to various species in the state, as reflected here in order of affected Title 14 section:
 - Section 360, Deer. Establish a late season buck hunt in Deer Hunt Zone D-7 (Fresno, Madera, Mariposa and Tulare counties).
 - Section 362, Nelson bighorn sheep. Adjust zone boundaries, split various zones into two hunting periods, increase flexibility for single zone fundraising tags, and modify hunt tag quotas.
 - Section 363, Pronghorn antelope. Modify hunt tag quotas
 - Sections 364 and 364.1, Elk and Shared Habitat Alliance for Recreational Enhancement (SHARE) elk hunting. Modify hunt tag quotas and SHARE tag allocations, extend hunt seasons in elk conflict zones, and add archery-only opportunities.
 - Section 708.5, Deer Tagging, Reporting and Testing Requirements. Define chronic wasting disease management zones (CMZs), establish mandatory sampling requirements to enhance chronic wasting

disease (CWD) surveillance within CMZs, establish what information hunters must provide with their harvested samples, and indicate how and where the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) provides current information on CWD detections in the state.

Determination: Adopted April 17, 2025 – The Commission has determined that this project will not have a significant adverse effect on the environment.
